

Monitoring and Clarifying:

Even the best readers occasionally hit *chunks* in their reading – words, phrases, ideas, concepts that don't make sense. Effective readers *monitor* their comprehension by recognizing points of confusion, then using fix-up strategies to *clarify* or correct the misunderstanding before moving on. Fix-up strategies might include rereading, reading on, skimming or scanning, or pausing to reflect.

*Does this make sense?
I don't really understand...
I'm not sure this is the right word...
I think I'll go back and reread...
Maybe if I read on...*

Context Clues

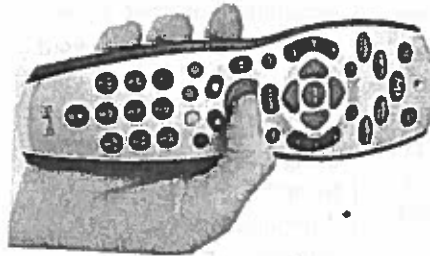
When you use clues in a story to figure out the meaning of a new word you are using context clues.



- Q Clues are in the same sentence as the new word and the sentences around it too.
- Q Clues can be found by thinking about how the word is used in the sentence.
- Q Clues can also be found by thinking about the main idea and details of the story.

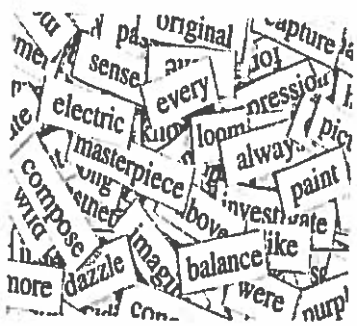
