Y Can Be Used as a Consonant or a Vowel

- When y comes at the beginning of a word, it is sounded as a consonant.
- When y comes at the end of a word, it is sounded as a vowel.
- When y is the only vowel at the end of a one syllable word, it is sounded like long i /ī/.
- When **y** comes at the end of a word with more than one syllable, it usually has a sound almost the same as **long** e /ē/.




